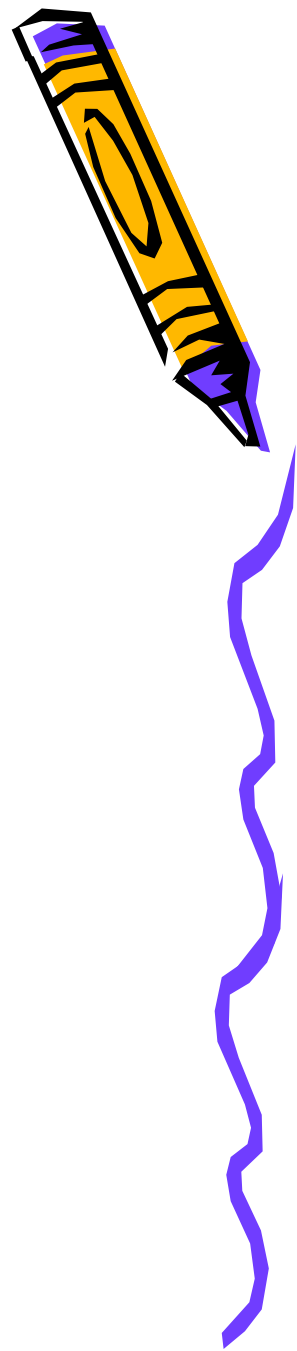

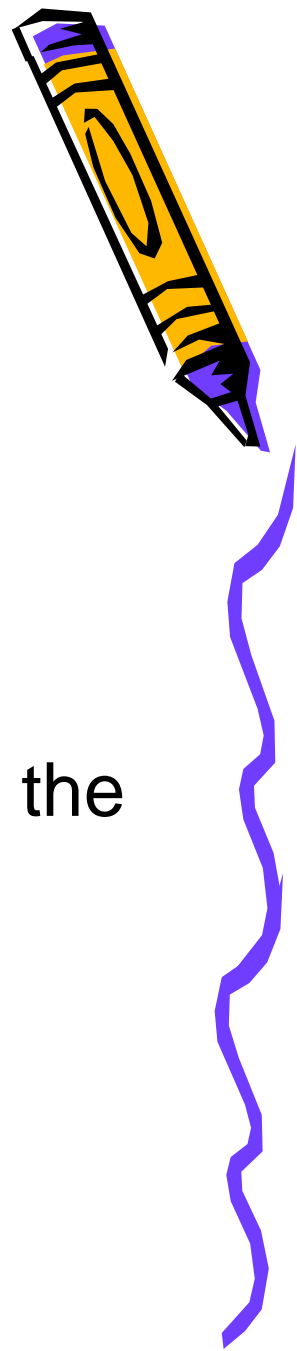
What are SATs?

Measuring Success

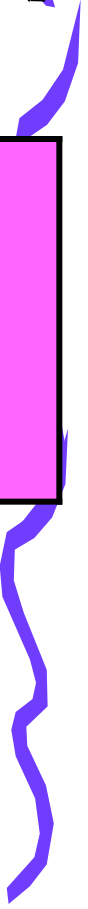
- Children are assessed in reading, writing, speaking and listening, mathematics and science;
- The emphasis is on teacher judgement;
- The children can be assessed throughout the year;
- The tests are used to inform final teacher judgements.



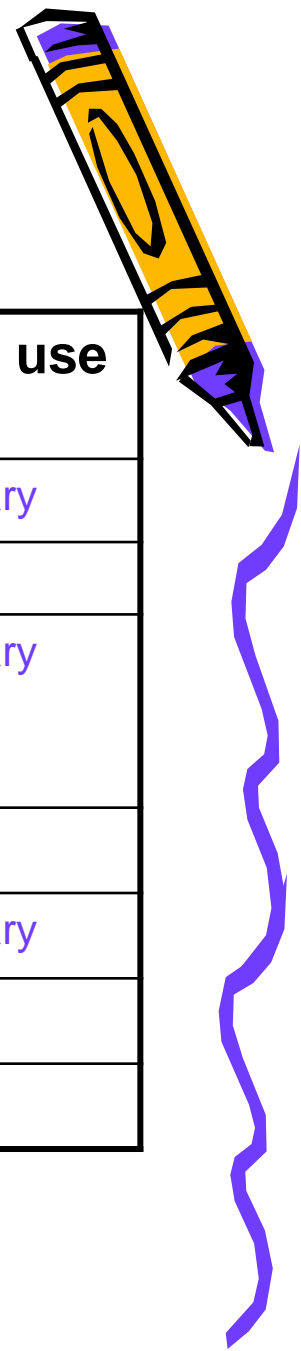

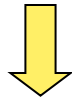
How can you be sure we are levelling correctly?

- We are provided with level descriptors to work from;
- We are closely monitored by the LA.

Consider the following:

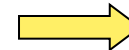
- Are the test/task results typical;
- Does this child tend to perform better orally than in written work;
- Is the teacher confident that the TA is based on a full range of evidence;
- How independent is the child's class work;
- Has the child been given sufficient opportunity to show what they can do.

Reporting



- Report only teacher assessments to the LA;
- We are obliged to report to parents only the teacher assessment levels;
- Parents must have access to test results if requested.



What can you do a home?

- Make number problems a part of every day life;
- Mathletics and multiplication tables;
- Completing homework activities.
